## Thoughtful design is the key to living small in this community of highly efficient apartments in Buenos Aires.

ow can architecture redefine domestic space? How can minimum space be maximized? How can people live in harmony with their environment? How can housing be affordable while upholding high standards aesthetically and sustainably? These are some of the questions explored by IR Arquitectura, a collective of architects and industrial designers founded in 2008 in Buenos Aires by Luciano Intile and Andrés Rogers. In their apartment project, Quintana 4598, they examined how to optimize compact and affordable living using thoughtful design.
