



## Concealed children's beds

Margriet Hoekstra designed this children's bedroom to conceal the beds, which are arranged around a shared central play area. The elevated beds allow for storage beneath and are hidden behind large timber shutters that can be closed off to give privacy. Step stools provide access to the beds as well as seating in the playroom.



## A loft bed for a child

In this home in the Swedish city of Gothenburg a narrow room has been transformed into a bedroom for two children with the addition of a loft bed. Constructed from painted white timber, the bed spans the entire width of the room, providing space below for another bed.

## A minimalist monochrome bunk bed

This small apartment, home of Swedish designer Joanna Bagger, has a reduced palette of monochrome colors. The family of four shares one bedroom with a built-in bunk bed for the children. A white bunk in the corner of the room has cupboards and drawers for storage beneath the lower bunk.
