07 A Modern Approach

When the Danish Confederation of Trade Unions built a “folk high school” for its apprentices in the late 1960s it did so in a decidedly Danish way. Lo-skolen is no grey concrete block with carpet tiles and a greasy canteen but a bright modernist village by the sea. Architects Jarl Heger and Karen & Ebbe Clemmensen designed everything from its white brick and red-tile buildings to the modernist chairs, desks and lamps, while the school’s huge collection of modern art reflects its founders’ visionary belief in their young protégés. With sympathetic updates by Fogh & Følner, the original design remains to this day.
