
#### Concept:

The World of Whales teaches children young and old about these gentle giants. Beautifully illustrated, it tells the story of how whales evolved, how they live and how humans and whales can live together. Dive in and explore these majestic mammals, one of the most fascinating animal species on the planet.

This workshop aims to teach children more about whales and our oceans and to explore the idea that looking after our planet is a collective responsibility. 



- *Time:* 15 min+ depending on craft chosen
- What: Collective collage made from recycled materials such as plastic bottles, egg cartons, cardboard and bubble wrap.
- Materials: Everyday items found in your recycling, glue, paper tape

#### What is the workshop:

In this collaborative workshop participants will use recycled materials to create a giant seascape, making seaweed from tissue, seashells from sweet wrappers and even turtles from egg cartons. They will also be encouraged to create unique drawings of magical sea creatures. There will be a visual guide of the image we are trying to create, with templates of whales and other animals for children to cut out and draw around. Having fun is key so if they would like to go off-piste, that is also fine! The aim is to foster creativity and make the children feel a sense of ownership over their part whilst learning more about the sea and the creatures that call it home and how we can help protect them.









Extra Craft:


Blue Whale

Age:	3+
Time:	15 min+
What:	Blue whale
Materials:	Plastic bottle, cardboard and any recycled material to fill, blue paint/pen



- 1. Gather all recycled materials including a plastic bottle.
- 2. Paint the bottle and any filling in the colour of your desired whale.
- 3. Add an eye and baleen plates on bottle to create the body of the whale.
- 4. Create a tail out of cardboard and stick into bottle neck.













Extra Craft:

Jellyfish

Age:	3+
Time:	15 min+
What:	Jellyfish
Materials:	Plastic bottle, cardboard, bubblewrap or tissue, pens to decorate





- 1. Gather all recycled materials including a plastic bottle and something for tentacles.
- 2. Cut off the end of the bottle for the jellyfish's body.
- 3. Cut strips of bubble-wrap or other material for tentacles and stick to inside of body.
- 4. Decorate body and add a friendly face!
