



## BIG CITY VIBES IN A SMALL KITCHEN

When asked about her approach to sourcing kitchen appliances for this Mexican apartment, LA-based designer Jessica Ayromloo replies that they were “the most petite and minimal possible.” This neat little kitchenette needed to house no more than a little fridge, a sink, and a stove-top for very occasional use. It occupies a space in a large open-plan room that also serves as a dining and living area and is characterized by a vibrant, colorful styling that Ayromloo describes as “industrial vintage modern.” Located right in the heart of Mexico City’s Centro Histórico, this apartment’s interior design takes inspiration from the locale and blends ornate ironwork with terra-cotta stone walls and blockwork tiling. The kitchen itself is made from stainless steel, softened by cabinets with cork fronts. Cork also features as one of the flooring materials. The countertop extends beyond the wall and into the room, and in order to make this feel less obtrusive, Ayromloo gave it a rounded end and a fabric “skirt” in a yellow that matches the surrounding tiles.
