

Mediterranean Modern

With a view of the Aegean Sea, this hotel on the island of Kos is based, like a traditional Greek settlement, around a central square, with numerous buildings made by Mastrominas Architecture. Each house takes the form of a modular cube shape with interior design by Berlin-based Lambs and Lions. Casa Cook Kos is described as a place “where mid-century design meets hand-crafted Moroccan charm and natural textures.” Straw sunshades are dotted around a swimming pool, which overlooks sand dunes and the beach. The buildings adjust to the weather conditions, with large sliding window frames that are secretly located in special niches; when the strong north meltemi wind blows, the beach-front window frames unfold. Inside, the rooms mix woven fabrics in neutral tones with chunky wooden furniture, wicker lampshades, and built-in Moroccan sofas. In each bathroom, huge mirrors reflect light around the minimalist space. Private terraces have Coco-Mat mattresses and rain showers making inside and outside equally livable.

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This hotel mixes mid-century design with Moroccan influences, from the wooden stools to the woven lampshades and wicker baskets.
