A JAILBREAK THAT FUELED THE DILLINGER LEGEND

A FAKE REVOLVER

During his time in jail, Dillinger came up with the ingenious idea of using an ordinary razor blade to sculpt a piece of wood into a replica revolver.

The skilled prisoner honed the piece to perfection, darkening it with the black polish he used to shine his shoes.

This was probably the main reason why the Crown Point guards did not see through the gangster's clever ruse.

On March 3, 1934, the famous bank robber pointed his fake revolver at the guard. The young man believed the gun was real and opened the cell door.

The guards Dillinger came across on his way out of jail were all stripped of their guns as soon as the bank robber managed to secure real machine guns from the police arsenal.


Finally, the coast was clear for the formidable robber, who was able to leave the prison in which he had been incarcerated less than two months before.

IN THE SHERIFF'S CAR

After having tricked the jail's security quards successfully, the fearsome fugitive wrapped up his escape by robbing Sheriff Lillian Holley's Ford V8 sedan and speeding off to Chicago in the police car.

Headlines across the US mocked the authorities for their failure to handle the situation, boosting the robber's fame even more, if that were possible.



DESTINATION: CHICAGO

The fugitive, now wanted in five states, sought refuge in Chicago with his girlfriend, Evelyn Frechette, whom he had met a few months before.

In those days, Chicago was a mafia hotspot. It was here that Dillinger managed to team up with other powerful criminals to continue his bank-robbing career.
