Category Reused Multitude of Sins estimates that the Circus Canteen interior is made up of about 90% reclaimed materials, coming from multiple sources, including a nearby commercial building that was being refurbished and a citywide appeal for unwanted household objects.

The Circus Canteen embodies the Indian philosophy of *Jugaad*. A resourceful approach to problemsolving deeply ingrained in Indian culture, it rejects consumerism and makes do with what is available.

Visitors to the 2,134-sq-ft (198-m²) restaurant are guided through a series of scrap metal archways, lit overhead by old automobile headlights suspended from bicycle chains; the flooring below is a patchwork assemblage of tile samples sourced from local ceramic showrooms. The walls of the restaurant are decorated with various signs and defunct electronics, and its secondhand furniture has been upcycled with maximalist motifs referencing the city's vibrant street culture.
