Part of what makes David Leggett's work so engaging is the variety of materials and stylistic sources he includes. "My work tackles many themes head-on. Hip-hop, art history, popular culture, sexuality, the racial divide, and self are all reoccurring subjects," he explains. The Los Angeles-based artist intentionally uses found imagery and craft materials, such as felt, to highlight his distrust of painting. A typical multimedia canvas includes painted elements alongside references to *The Simpsons*, children's stickers, and stills from *The Color Purple* or *Star Trek*. "In my work, cultural and personal relationships collide to meet one another, but there is never a resolve between the two," he points out. "Life doesn't always have a silver-lined Hollywood ending. My work deals with many contradictions." Leggett's work balances humor and horror. "I take many of my cues from stand-up comedians, which I listen to while in my studio," he observes wryly.
