Floating in the Air Above a Norwegian Fjord

Bolder Sky Lodges by Norgeshus Lysefjord, Norway

The state-of-the-art Bolder Sky Lodges are bold in both name and nature, and the name is also a reference to the boulders that make up this rugged Norwegian landscape, created millions of years ago during the last ice age. The two-story structures are not built into the ground but raised above it, on piles drilled into solid bedrock. Sited on the very edge of a cliff and fronted with large plate-glass windows, the cabins give inhabitants the sensation of floating above the landscape, with Lysefjord—the southernmost of Norway's biggest fjords—below, stretching into the distance for miles. The Bolder Sky Lodges are the brainchild of entrepreneur Tom Norland, who wants to take Norwegian tourism in a new, more immersive direction. Their bold design fully embodies his desire to give guests an opportunity to reconnect with the most pristine natural surroundings with minimal impact on the natural landscape.
