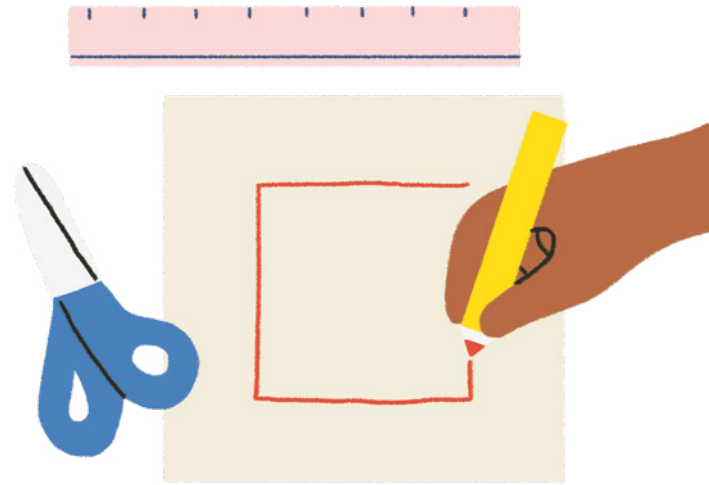


Window Camera

Create an easy-peasy camera to watch the world through. It doesn't click and you can't keep the pictures, but peep through its cardboard window and you will notice all sorts of natural wonders.

You will need:

- A ruler and a pen
- A piece of cardboard (such as an old cereal box)
- A pair of scissors



1. Use a ruler to draw a square in the middle of your piece of cardboard. Make sure you have a border outside the square.



2. Pierce a hole in the middle of the cardboard with scissors, then cut around the inside of the square to make a window.



3. Grab your window camera, a notebook, and a pen, and go outside. Hold your camera up to anything interesting that you see.



4. Lots of wild things grow in towns and cities. Seek out plants pushing up through pavements and wildflowers on walls.

Look up through the trees and zoom in on the ground. There is something to find, no matter where you point your camera.

Try using your camera to look closely at plants or insects.

- Make a list of the birds, insects, and minibeasts that you find.
- Draw a map of where you found each one.
- Sketch a view seen through your camera.

Can you spot any trails of ants moving around?
