Holistic treatments take inspiration from Nordic sea salt, herbs, and detoxifying charcoal, as a nod to the local landscape. Guests warm up with a shot of “skin lemonade,” a health tonic made from aloe vera, lavender flower water, and cleansing licorice root extract “to strengthen the gut and liver,” says Bonné. From there, you can ease into a muscle-sculpting, crystal-stone facial, deep-tissue massage, and body wrap, or pore-refining charcoal and lava mask. Everything finishes with a cold matcha tea, infused with birch and wheatgrass, for a reviving effect.

The spa can only accommodate two guests at a time, making it a secluded, meditative experience (non-guests can book when no one else is staying at THEKRANE). The vertiginous space is beautiful on a clear day but gazing out at storm clouds through the large windows might be even more appealing to the Danish hygge sensibility. As Kastbjerg puts it: “Who wants to sit inside and miss the nature?”
