ROLY-POLY DAYBED — The two-piece Roly-Poly Daybed, created by British designer Faye Toogood, comprises a spherical headrest and a tablet-like body that have been formed from a milky, translucent fiberglass that looks both glossy and faded. Each daybed is supplied with a hand-woven yarn throw.

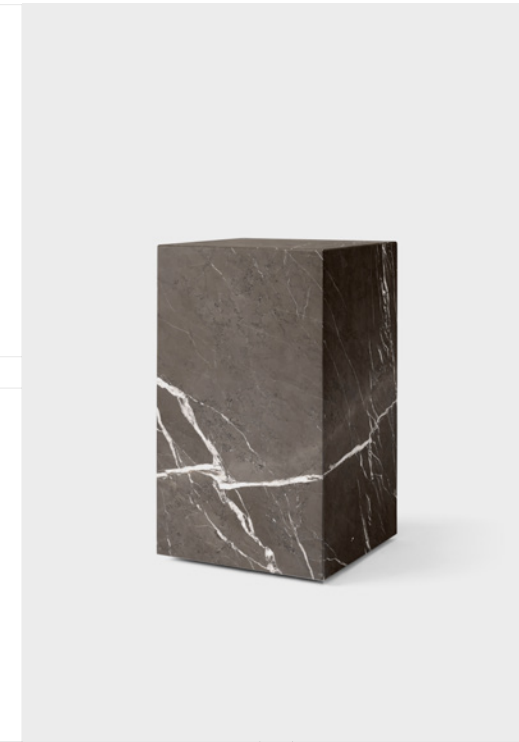
